

Featured Wines of the Rhône

The Rhône Valley has been a hub of wine culture since ancient times and is just as popular today. The Northern and Southern Rhône are unique, each with vastly different geography, climate, soils and grape varieties, but share one thing in common – the Rhône River.

Rhône Reds from North to South

François Villard, L'Appel des Sereines Syrah, 2016

3oz - \$7 6oz - \$13 9oz - \$19 Bottle - \$50

A blend from four parcels ranging from Ardoix in St-Joseph to St-Michel-sur-Rhône and Vérin near Condrieu, this syrah exudes cool blue fruit and dark-berried richness with a refreshing eucalyptus note and vibrant acidity.

Château de Saint Cosme, Saint-Joseph Syrah, 2017

3oz - \$11 6oz - \$20 9oz - \$29 Bottle - \$98

Scents of smoke, crushed stone and black olives blend with flavors of beautiful blackberry, black raspberries, cured meats, and pepper.

This Syrah is fresh, fruity, well-balanced and easy to drink.

Finishes with a hint of oak, a seamless texture, and fine tannins.

Vins de Vienne, Crozes-Hermitage Syrah, 2017

Bottle - \$55

Product of a collaboration of three renowned Rhône winemakers;

Pierre Gaillard, Yves Cuilleron and François Villar.

This dry-style wine offers aromas of tobacco and coffee along with spicy, floral and fruity scents and features a broad texture and smooth tannins.

André Brunel, Côtes du Rhône Villages

Cuvée Sabine Rouge, 2015

Harmonious blend of strength and elegance with expressions of pretty plum and dark cherry laced with subtle spice and dried star anise notes.

Blend is mostly Grenache with a small percentage of Syrah and Mourvedre.

Le Mas des Flauzieres, La Grande Réserve, Gigondas, 2016

Bottle - \$55

Blackberry and cherry flavors are fleshy and forward in this supple, intensely juicy, fruit-driven wine.

Made from 70% Grenache, it is silky but builds in density and tannic structure with a slight hint of Asian plum on the finish.

Domaine de Marcoux, Lirac 'La Lorentine', 2016

Aromas of cedar, clove, cinnamon and tobacco give rise to bright cherry sauce and red licorice flavors backed by a fruitcake note, offering a polished, silky finish.

Château La Nerthe, Châteauneuf-du-Pape Rouge, 2015

Bottle - \$115

This highly rated classic red exhibits exotic toasted coconut and vanilla aromas.

Hints of cinnamon, clove and cherry linger on a silky finish

picking up anise, toasted sandalwood and

juniper notes along the way, creating a steaky, savory Châteauneuf.

Château Pesquié Terrasses Rouge, Ventoux, 2016

3oz - \$6 6oz - \$12 9oz - \$17 Bottle - \$46

This blend of 70% Grenache and 30% Syrah offers a terrific bouquet of black cherries, wild herbs, dried flowers and spicy black pepper.

Very balanced with round tannins, this sexy wine is beautifully textured with surprising minerality, complexity, weight and charm.
